'Do we get it?'

s we look back to the first Ascension Day (which we will commemorate this week on Thursday), we realise that the disciples then still didn't quite get it. Throughout Jesus' ministry, many fell into the popular thinking that the Messiah would be a warrior sent to overthrow mighty Rome and thus save his people. While Jesus' crucifixion no doubt put a damper on the messianic hopes, his resurrection surely fanned the flames of their zeal: "He flames of their z



resurrection surely fanned the flames of their zeal: "He conquered death! Now he will vanquish our enemies!"

Even after forty days of intense instruction about the Kingdom of God, the disciples still misunderstood: "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" Did you catch that? They want to know if they will now be independent again. Jesus had said "Kingdom of God," but all they heard was politics. The disciples want justice and freedom for the people, but their vision is too limited. God's kingdom stretches far beyond the confines of Judea. It reaches into Samaria and to the ends of the earth. In other words, God's kingdom is not only for them; it is also for the Samaritans and Gentiles. God's kingdom is for all.

As the disciples process this information, Jesus is lifted up and carried away from them. They stare after him with mouths gaping and heads spinning. "What do we do now? He was the one. Now, he's gone again, and we're not any closer to the kingdom God promised. We can't do it alone."

Here is the good news: they are not alone, and neither are we! The power of the Holy Spirit urges Christ's disciples on. It keeps our focus on things of God rather than the things of this world. It gives us the courage to seek justice and strength to work for freedom. It leads us out of our comfort zones and into places Christ calls us to go.

As we consider our own response to Ascension Day, do we get it?

God of power, expand our vision and move our feet to do your will. Amen'
